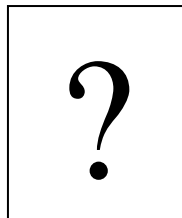
Adventure/Fantasy/Musical

(2007) ( UK/France/USA) (15)

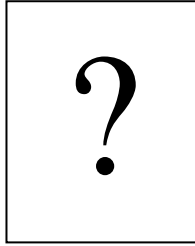


Black Comedy
